## CJEU judgment on Schrems II Case

On 16<sup>th</sup> July 2020, the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) in case of Data Protection Commissioner vs Facebook Ireland and Maximilian Schrems invalidated the decision on the adequacy of the protection provided by the EU-US Privacy Shield. Well-known multinational retail chain Walmart Inc. is facing class-action lawsuit under recently enforced California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) for a data breach incident exposing customer names, addresses, financial data and other information causing significant injuries and damage to the consumers.

# Italian watchdog fines telcos

The Italian data protection authority ('Garante') announced fine EUR 17 million on Wind Tre SpA, an Italian telecom operator for several unlawful data processing activities mostly related to marketing over SMS, email, fax and by phone.

Similarly, another phone operator Iliad was also fined EUR 0.8 million for employees' access to traffic data.



## Belgian DPA fines for unlawful data processing

The Belgian data protection authority (DPA) issued a fine of EUR 10,000 on a company for unlawful processing and non-compliance with data subject rights.

The company had mistakenly sent marketing communications to the claimant, who was not the customer; later the claimant exercised his right of access which company failed to respond within the deadline set forth under the GDPR.
