

ITC cannot be blocked on officer's whim

In a reprieve to the GST assessees, the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) has made it clear that ITC of a taxpayer can be blocked after an officer specifies a concrete reason. The CBIC has issued guidelines in this regard in which it has been made clear that from now on, the officers will not block the ITC without recording "reason to believe" in writing
