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5% GST on auto-rickshaw services provided through e-commerce platforms

Auto-rickshaw services provided through e-commerce platforms would attract 5% GST from January 1, 2022. The Revenue Department under the Finance Ministry through a notification dated November 18 withdrew the GST exemption available to auto rickshaws providing passenger transport services through e-commerce platforms. While the passenger transport services provided by auto rickshaw drivers through offline/ manual mode would continue to be exempt


Employees liable to pay GST on salaries received in lieu of notice period: AAR
