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
The European Commission published its first report on the evaluation and review of the Data Protection Law Enforcement Directive.



The President of Ireland signed the Communications (Retention of Data) (Amendment) Bill 2022 into law.



The Danish Data Protection Authority published a questionnaire for data controllers to assess whether their use of cloud services complies with the data protection rules.



Czech Republic's Data Watchdog issued a fine of CZK 975,000 on the Ministry of Interior for unauthorised processing of personal data through the Quarantine app by the Police of the Czech Republic.



The European Union Agency for Network and Information Security released the 2021 annual reports on Telecom Security Incidents and Trust Services Security Incidents.





The U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation approved the Children and Teens' Online Privacy Protection Act and the Kids Online Safety Act.



U.S. Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency signed a Memorandum of Cooperation on cybersecurity with the Ukrainian State Service of Special Communications and Information Protection of Ukraine.



The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau fined the U.S. Bank National Association for USD 37.5 million for multiple violations including unlawfully accessing customers' credit reports and sensitive personal data.



The New York Department of Financial Services proposes changes to it cybersecurity rules.

INDIA AND ASIA PACIFIC

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India published a consultation paper on Leveraging Artificial Intelligence and Big Data in Telecommunication Sector.



Bangladesh's Department of Information and Communication Technology released the draft Data Protection Act, 2022.



Japan's DISCO Inc. issued a notice addressing a data breach potentially affecting the personal information of up to 298,826 customers.



The Cyberspace Administration of China announced a cooperation plan with the National Cyber and Cryptography Agency of Indonesia.

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
