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EU and UK



Commissioner for Personal Data Protection of Cyprus published a statement on the extent to which police can publish photos of suspects.



Finland's Data Protection Ombudsman warned healthcare providers about the use of tools to analyze the personal data of patients.



European Parliament approved draft rules for cross-border sharing of information to fight terrorism.



UK's Information Commissioner's Office published draft guidelines on health information of workers for public consultation. The consultation will remain open until 26 January 2023.



Americas



Federal Trade Commission (FTC) takes action against Drizly, an online alcohol marketplace for alleged security failure causing a data breach of about 2.5 million consumers.



California Privacy Protection Agency announced its admission to the Global Privacy Assembly as a full voting member.



Consumer Financial Protection Bureau launched new rulemaking that strengthens consumers' access and control over their financial data.



Senator for Oregon called for security clearance for FTC Privacy Regulators for protection against cybersecurity threats.



India and Asia Pacific



New Zealand's Privacy Commissioner launched a survey on how small businesses deal with personal data every day. Responses may be submitted until 18 November 2022.



Japan's Ministry of Economy, Trade, and Industry released a draft of revised Cybersecurity Management Guidelines. Comments may be submitted until 6 December 2022.

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
